Now the house is temporary home to vestry retreats, youth groups, women's groups, writers, musicians, and many others. Valle Crucis will be host to some wonderful new and returning guest speakers and weekend learning opportunities. As the days lengthen and the soft air of spring returns, look for our outside Labyrinth to be restored, etched in stone and grass into the field near the creek. We will be preparing our woodland and waterfall trails for new adventures, airing out the Hermitages for spring, and welcoming groups from across the United States to renew their spiritual journeys with us. I hope you'll join us in this new beginning for the Valle Crucis Conference Center.

Bonnie attended Valle Crucis School and LaGrange College in Georgia. She was a Girl Scouts Troop Leader and spent many summers as the Waterfront Director at Camp Pine Valley in Meansville, GA.

"Miss Bonnie" taught swimming for decades with the Girl Scouts and community swim programs in Georgia and Alabama. Bonnie and her husband, Cliff, were avid sailors and competed in regattas all over the Southeast. Late in life, Bonnie skippered her own sailboat, named *Hotflash*, to many Chattahoochee Sailing Club championships.

Bonnie loved her time at Valle Crucis; she often said, "All that is good in me came from my time at Valle Crucis." We are truly blessed to have remained in Bonnie's affections after all these years.

Advanced Intensive Centering Prayer Retreat: Deepening the Silence

This retreat is designed for those who would like a more prolonged experience of centering prayer and who are interested in entering into the more profound levels of spiritual practice in an atmosphere of silence, solitude, and community.

Centering prayer is a silent form of prayer that directs a person's attention toward God. It is a prayer form with ancient roots in the mystical and monastic tradition of the Christian faith. The retreat is intended to help develop and sustain a regular centering prayer practice. In addition to several Centering Prayer periods offered daily, you will also have opportunities for contemplative worship, individual meetings with retreat leaders, walks and hiking around the Conference Center grounds, access to our labyrinth, as well as time for solitude and reflection.



Retreat leaders are Becky Hannah (828-702-3518), co-coordinator of Contemplative Outreach of Western NC and Joan Ricci Thome, presenter of contemplative prayer retreats at the Oratory and St. Francis Springs Prayer Center in Stoneville, NC. The Rev. Robert Cook, Vicar of Christ Church, Walnut Grove, NC is spiritual director for the week. Joan and Becky have both been trained to present centering prayer by Contemplative Outreach, the organization founded by Father Thomas Keating as a spiritual network committed to living the contemplative dimension of the gospel in everyday life. Please feel free to call Becky if you have any questions about the retreat.

Due to the length of this retreat, each participant should have an established practice of Centering Prayer for at least a year. This retreat is limited to the first 20 registrants. Participants must stay on campus and plan to attend the entire retreat.

General Program Information:

- We believe it is in the small group environment that learning and spirituality flourish. Because class sizes are limited, they fill up quickly. Early registration is encouraged!
- Prices for multi-day programs include room, board, tuition, and materials. Most rooms are double or more occupancy. If you have a medical reason to request a single room, we will do our best to accommodate you; due to the limited number of single rooms, we cannot guarantee until check-in when final availability of single rooms can be determined. Please notify VCCC in advance if you have any medical needs such as diet or different ability accommodations.
- We are a pet and smoke-free facility.
- **Deposits are non-refundable.** We appreciate that unforeseen circumstances may arise that may prevent your attendance; in that case, we will consider your deposit a tax-deductible donation to our ongoing ministry.
- We serve hearty, nutritious meals. Our kitchen will do their utmost to meet dietary requirements. If you have diet requests, please let us know at least 14 days in advance so that we can prepare accordingly.
- Unless otherwise noted, conferences begin with registration and check-in at 4:00 p.m., followed by dinner at 6:30 p.m. Conferences close after the Noon lunch on closing day. To assist our housekeeping staff, we request that you complete your check-out prior to lunch on closing day.


